The Parish Council met on 5 July 2017 It was told that the **village pond survey** has now been completed and helpful suggestions made on how to make the area more environmentally friendly and clear the pond. Work needs to be carried out during winter and then summer, so the Council deferred further action on this matter until later in the year.
